Biographical Note

Eleanor Creveling House Smith (1915-1996) was born in Chatham, Connecticut, to Harold and Ethel E. (Donnellan) House. Harold House was a carpenter and farmer from Pennsylvania, and Ethel came from a family of Connecticut farmers.

When Smith was about 4 or 5 years old her parents purchased a farm on Hillsdale Road in Richmond, Rhode Island. Smith was married to Earl Smith (1909-1982) in 1934. The couple continued to live on Hillsdale Road for the remainder of their lives. Earl Smith worked as a mechanic at the Fred W. Smith Car Dealership (then in the location of today's Chariho Furniture) and a janitor at Richmond school. He also volunteered at the Richmond Fire Department. Both were members of the Richmond Grange and involved with the Washington County Fair following its move to Route 112. The couple had one daughter and four grandchildren.

Smith was a prolific writer on nature, crafting, and farm life. Beginning in the 1940s, she contributed to many local publications including *The Spectator, South County Shopper's Guide, Stich 'n Sew, Popular, Handicraft, NewSource* and others. The majority of these writings took place between 1967 and 1987.

Smith had many other interests and hobbies. She sewed clothing and at one time worked as a seamstress. She also tatted, made seashell jewelry, gardened and canned food.

Throughout her life Smith remained active in her community. She was a founding member of the Richmond Historical Society and served as its archivist. She also served on the Richmond Conservation Commission and the Richmond Senior Citizens Commission from the early 1980s until her passing.

Scope and Content

The records of the Eleanor Creveling House Smith Collection include correspondence, a journal, manuscripts, newspaper clippings and a postal mail log. Then majority of the collection was created and compiled by Smith between 1948 and 1996. In 2023 David Smith wrote an article about Smith for *The Westerly Sun*. The article, and the photographs used in it, have been added to the collection.
