#### **Historical Note**

The Friends of Kingston Station was nonprofit corporation established by South Kingstown, Rhode Island, residents Barbara Dirlam, John Hall, and Frank Heppner in 1973. Its primary goal was to preserve and protect the Kingston Train Station, a wood-framed structure built in 1875 by the New York, Providence and Boston Railroad. The station, currently part of Amtrak's Northeast Corridor, is the oldest wood frame passenger train station remaining in continuous service in the United States. It was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1978.

The Friends led several efforts to restore and revitalize the Kingston station, the first of which took place in the mid-1970s. After a fire damaged the station in 1988 the Friends spearheaded a \$3.5 million restoration and modernization project that was completed in 1998. In recognition of the Friends's efforts to preserve the station the RI Department of Transportation allowed the organization to use half of the station for a museum of railroad history and technology that operated from 2002-2020. The organization has also offered a variety of education, safety, and rail travel promotion services. In 2021, the remaining members voted to dissolve the group.

## **Scope and Content**

The records of the Friends of Kingston Station include meeting miniutes, correspondence, photographs, telegrams, railroad ephemera, architectural drawings, maps, and news clippings. Records fall into two series: materials created in the course of the Friends's activities and materials collected by the Friends related to the history of the station and local railroads. The series are organized as follows:

This series contains records related to the Friends's creation, governance, initiatives, and projects from 1972 to 2021. Of note are records related to the restoration undertaken by the Friends and the rededication ceremony in 1998. These records also document the establishment of the

railroad museum and the relocation of the signal tower. Additionally, the Friends worked closely with the Friends of the South County Bike Path during the creation of the William C.
