Historical Note

The Town of South Kingstown, Rhode Island, was officially incorporated on February 26, 1722/23 when it was divided from the Town of North Kingstown by an act of the state General Assembly. Prior to this act the two towns were called jointly Kings Towne or later Kingstown, which was governed by a Town Council. When Rhode Island was divided into counties in 1729, South Kingstown became the seat of Kings County (now Washington County). After the American Revolution, Little Rest (now the village of Kingston) become one of five state capitals where the General Assembly held annual sessions from 1776 to 1807. In 1888, an area of land between Narragansett Bay and the Pettaquamscutt River was incorporated as the District of Narragansett by the Rhode Island General Assembly. The District of Narragansett was treated as a voting district of South Kingstown until it was chartered as a separate town in March 1901.

Town Government. Records in this collection represent a variety of responsibilities carried out by the elected Town Council and the Town Government at the Council's direction. In the early period of its function, the Town Council was responsible for appointing town officials who were required to sign surety bonds to the town treasurer, promising to fulfill the duties of their position under penalty. The Town Council also issued probate bonds to assign an individual to administer the estate of a deceased person. When an enslaved person was freed, the enslaver was required to sign a bond of indemnification with the Town Council. The Town Council also issued court summons, arrest warrants, and liquor licenses. In 1968 voters approved a new Charter of South Kingstown that authorized the Town Council to appoint a full-time town manager.

Public Welfare. Matters of public welfare such as providing housing, clothing, healthcare, and other services to residents of South Kingstown living in poverty and assigning guardianship of children were overseen by the Town, primarily through the office of Overseer (also titled "Warden") of the Poor, from the early 18th century until the adoption of modern public welfare systems in the early 20th century. The Overseer of the Poor was frequently responsible for ensuring the welfare of children born out of wedlock (referred to in the records as "bastards") as well as impoverished individuals and those experiencing homelessness (referred to in the records

as "transients"). The Overseer of the Poor later administered the institution known as the Town Farm (also referred to as the "Town Asylum" or "Town Poor Farm"), a residence for those in the Town's charge that was located on land now occupied by the main campus of South County Health. The Town Farm began its operation in 1852 and ended in the 1920s.

Taxation. Annual tax books have been published by the Town continually since the eighteenth century. In the 19th century, the Town was divided into "highway districts" for the purpose of taxation. A surveyor was assigned to each district to assess property values.

Finance. The Town Treasurer was responsible for managing the town's budget and publishing annual reports. As part of its function, the Town Council was responsible for approving any invoices and expenses. Once approved, the Town Clerk would issue a payment authorization to the Town Treasurer, allowing for these transactions to proceed. Today, this function is fulfilled by the Finance Department, which is overseen by the Town Manager and Town Council.

Public Works and Utilities. The Public Works and Utilities Department is responsible for the maintenance of Town roads, bridges, and infrastructure, including water and wastewater management.

Animal Control. The Town of South Kingstown regularly paid animal bounties in the 19th century as means of controlling pest and animal populations. In 1860, the Rhode Island General Assembly passed a law requiring the licensing of dogs. The Town also had a dog fund that was used to compensate those whose property or livestock were damaged by dogs. Today, the Animal Control Department is a unit of the Public Safety Division.

Public Schools. The Barnard School Act of 1845 established the basic structure of the South Kingstown Public school system, and the Town was divided into twenty-one different schoolhouse districts. Each district had its own trustee, clerk, and treasurer. The South Kingstown School Committee, an elected board of six individuals, appoints a superintendent to oversee the operation of these schoolhouses. The South Kingstown High School was established in 1877. The school districts were consolidated over time, and by the 1960s the Town public school system was comprised of seven elementary schools and one high school.

Elections. The Town Clerk maintains lists of registered voters and administers local elections and budget referendums.

Building Inspection and Zoning. The Building Inspection and Zoning Department is responsible for issuing building permits, conducting health and safety inspections, and enforcing town ordinances. This department also issued fuel permits to individuals who wished to store gasoline or kerosene.

Police. Prior to the 20th century the Town Sergeant and Town Constables acted as the Town's primary means of law enforcement. The modern version of the South Kingstown Police Department began in 1927 when the Town Council appointed Walter L. McNulty as the Town's first police officer. By 1931 the size of the police force had grown to eight officers, and McNulty became the Chief of Police. At that time operations were directed from a one-room basement in the rear of Clark's store (now Phil's Diner) at 323 Main Street. Since then, the Department Headquarters have relocated twice, moving from Main Street to Commodore Perry Highway in 1964, and then to the intersection of Kingstown and Curtis Corner Roads in 1998.

Veterans Service Center. In 1945 South Kingstown established the Veterans Service Center, which operated out of Town Hall. This Department, which no longer exists, assisted local veterans in obtaining employment, education, and healthcare.

Kingston Historic District Commission. In the 1950s, the Kingston Historic District Commission was established to serve in an advisory capacity to the Town Planning Board and the Town Council on historic preservation issues. The Commission also has review authority for projects impacting the Town-designated Kingston Historic District.

Scope and Content

The South Kingstown Town Records include bonds, building permits, financial statements, invoices, meeting minutes, payment authorizations, payment receipts, petitions, police reports, school reports, scrapbooks, tax books, and other records pertaining to the Town government.

This collection constitutes only a portion of South Kingstown's government records, and the accumulation of this collection is ongoing. As a result, some of the series only offer a partial set of records.

The materials fall into eleven series: records related to the Town Council, public welfare, taxes, finance, animal control, public works and utilities, public schools, elections, building inspection and zoning, the police department, and town planning. The series are arranged chronologically so as to reflect the development of the Town government. The series are organized as follows:
